Senate Bill 240 passed with unanimous approval in both the Senate and the House, so please thank your local Senators and Representatives for their support. You will learn how the 2023 Legislative Session impacts you during the conference.

The 2024 Legislative Session interim committee weeks start in October 2023, and the Session kicks off the second week of January 2024. The Session will end in March 2024. Should you have items you wish to be considered for inclusion in FACTE's 2024 Legislative agenda please share with your Board representative or contact me directly.

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













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
